

PARENT/CARER BULLETIN 9 March 2023

FORTNIGHTLY HIGHLIGHTS

As you are already aware, the NEU (National Education Union) have scheduled two further days of strike action which will take place on **Wednesday 15th and Thursday 16th March**.

The strikes continue to take place because of an ongoing national dispute between the NEU and the Government over teachers' pay, the inadequate levels of government funding for schools and a national recruitment and retention crisis in education and not issues which are specifically related to IGS.

Based on the information we have available, including confirmation from members of the NEU of their intention to strike, we have repeated our risk assessment to determine specific arrangements for next Wednesday and Thursday. The following decisions have been taken:

On both days, Wednesday 15th March and Thursday 16th March, Ilkley Grammar School will be open to students in all years with an EHCP, EAL students including students from Ukraine and Looked After Children. If your child has an EHCP, is LAC or EAL in years 7-10, please will you confirm whether you expect your child to attend school by completing a short survey HERE. If we do not receive confirmation by 9am on Monday 13th March, we will assume that they are completing the learning activities at home.

Wednesday 15th March:

School will be open as normal for students in years 11 and 13. It will also be open for students in year 12 from break onwards due to staffing constraints periods 1 and 2.

School will therefore be closed for students in years 7-10 unless they have an EHCP, are LAC or EAL.

Thursday 16th March:

School will be open as normal for students in years 11,12 and 13. It will also be open for year 10 although there will be a slightly earlier finish at 2.05 due to staffing constraints period 6. School buses will depart at the normal time and a supervised space will be available for students in Y10 who need to remain on site until 3pm.

NB: The mock examinations for students in year 11 which have been scheduled to take place next week will go ahead as planned.

Arrangements for students who are not in school due to strike action:

Where teachers are not striking, work will be set in line with the curriculum. This will take the form of structured materials on Showbie, recorded or live sessions in line with students' timetables. Wherever possible, teachers who are not striking will be available via email or Teams to answer any questions and provide support during the timetabled lesson.

Where teachers are striking, specific work will not be set. This is because when teachers are exercising their lawful and legitimate right to strike, they are withdrawing their labour and this includes not preparing and setting cover work, including any work to be delivered online.

Where work is not set, IGS will provide examples of activities to help students to consolidate their learning, advanced information of upcoming assessments and will direct students to useful learning resources available online. Details will be sent in a separate communication early next week.

Students Entitled To Free School Meals:

If your child is in years 7-10 and is entitled to Free School Meals, please complete this form by 9am on Monday 13th March to indicate whether you would like additional packed lunches to be provided for the days when school is partially closed. These would need to be collected from school at the end of the day on Tuesday 14th March.

Negotiations between the unions and the Government are continuing. Should a resolution be achieved and the strikes are called off, school will be open as usual. In any case, school will be re-open as normal on Friday 17th March.

Spanish Exchange to Madrid

On the morning of Thursday 19th February Year 11 and 12 Students said goodbye to their families and set off on a new and exciting cultural experience: the Spanish exchange to Madrid which is now in its 15th Year with Escuela Pías in Pozuelo Madrid. 31 students and 3 teachers from Modern Foreign Languages journeyed to Spain's capital and surrounding regions. We enjoyed day trips to the city of Toledo, the ancient capital of Spain, known as the city of the 3 religions with a Catholic Cathedral, its Jewish Basilica and its Moorish Muslim Mosque as well as being the adoptive home of the artist 'El Greco'. We also visited the beautiful city of Segovia with its 'Al-cazar' (Fortress) renowned for being the inspiration behind Walt Disney's Magic Kingdom as well as exploring many of Madrid's alluring attractions including the spectacular Plaza Mayor, Palacio Real as well as many other cultural sites including the world-famous Reina Sofia Museo de Arte where we gazed upon Picasso's wondrously captivating 'El Guernica' mural. Students were fully immersed in the culture having spent the whole week with host families to, not only improve their Spanish acquisition, but also heighten their cultural capital via the art, architecture, gastronomy, history, and mucho mucho más. We are very much looking forward to welcoming our Spanish 'compadres' on their leg of the exchange this Wednesday 15th March for a week.
