Year 10 Football

The National 'B team' cup: IGS have progressed to round 3 of the national cup after beating St Aidan's, Harrogate 1-0. It was a very tight game with the opposition piling on the pressure in the second half, but Benji Newton made countless fantastic saves to maintain Ilkley's clean sheet and help guide them to the next round. We welcome a team from the North East region in the next round in the last 32!

West Yorkshire Cup Quarter Final: Sadly, the Year 10 cup run in the WY cup has come to an end after suffering a 5-2 loss to Ryburn Academy. It was a fierce competition against a very physical side. Despite Ilkley taking an early lead, Ryburn capitalised on break away chances. We wish them the very best of luck in the semi-finals vs Cardinal Heenan.

National Cup: IGS Vs St Matthews RC, Moston, Manchester 24/11/23: The Y10 team have booked a place in round 5 (last 64 teams of 674!) in the ESFA national cup after beating St Matthews 8-7 on sudden death penalties. The team showed great resilience to come back from being 2-0 down at half time, scoring four fantastic second half goals. The game was tied 4-4 at full time, and after 10 minutes of extra time... requiring penalties to decide the tie! IGS took the first penalty and scored all eight, St Matthews followed suit until the 8th sudden death penalty which was saved by a strong leap by George Hannam! The cup run continues! We play Spen Valley high school in the next round.

Year II Football

Regrettably, the Year 11 football team couldn't retain the Leeds Cup title this year. Despite facing a 2-0 deficit against Horsforth School, they showcased remarkable resilience, clawing their way back to a 2-2 draw. The match culminated in a penalty shootout where, despite their best efforts, they narrowly succumbed. Now, all focus shifts to the winning Champions of Leeds Cup in the near future. A commendable performance by all involved.





The Yorkshire School Chess Championship

The Yorkshire School Chess Championship took place on Friday 17th November. There were 32 teams from 14 schools entered and IGS submitted 2 x teams of four students. It was an impressive set up hosted by St Bede's and St Joseph's in Bradford, with 64 games of chess being played simultaneously. The matches were a maximum of 30 mins to play and there was time to play three rounds with Ilkley A team sitting in second place on current standings. Unfortunately, there was not enough time to complete all 6 rounds of chess so there will be another event in Feb/March where the tournament can be completed. The level of interest in the event was wonderful as was the calibre of the games being played. A big thanks to our representatives from IGS who did a magnificent job representing the school with plenty still to play for in the next event.

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On Wednesday 15th November Year 13 student Jacob Dawson-Watts visited the Refugee Action (Bradford Group) with Mrs Tomblin (who has worked with Refugee Action for 7 years) as part of his Photography A level project. This was a sensitive and carefully planned visit as it involved securing the permissions from the charity and participants to take photographs of members of the community, many of whom have limited English, have experienced trauma, are living in complex circumstances and whose futures are uncertain. Jacob was introduced to families from, among others, Algeria, Iran, Nigeria, Sudan, Iraqi Kurdistan,



Senegal and El Salvador. He took care to explain his project and photographed children of all ages and their parents – making sure that his photos protected his subjects from being directly identified by always focussing on aspects other than the face. It was particularly humbling for Jacob to meet a young man of 17, the same age as himself, who had been in the UK just 20 days, and is here by himself. Jacob took it all in his stride and treated everyone with the dignity and respect deserving of any photographic model. All participants from Wednesday have agreed to have their work form part of Jacob's A Level Photography portfolio and also an exhibition at school. Mrs Tomblin is also arranging a return visit with Jacob so the models can see the pictures. Thank you to Mrs Tomblin for facilitating this very special visit.



Moor Road Closure

In addition to the disruption on the A65 by Manor Bends and the planned industrial action causing disruption to rail services, we are also aware that the **Moor Road will be closed 6, 7, 8 December** between the Cow and Calf and Robin Hole Campsite on Stead Lane (before the Moor Lane junction). The sign indicates this road is shut between the hours of 9am and 5pm (see image) so whilst not affecting your morning journey to school if may affect your journey home on those dates.

Parking
