Students have received the award for demonstrating school values, being positive role models and making a positive difference to others in line with our school vision.














Dance




Oxford Trip: Eleanor Tolch (P-16)

Oxford is an extremely prestigious university, evident through the multiple interviews you must go through to be accepted and the high quality of education with around one to two tutoring sessions a week and personalised feedback to track your progress continuously. All the professors and lecturers are experts in their field, allowing you to achieve absolute academic success at every step of the way.

From Monday 8th April to Tuesday 9th April, 28 year 12 students and 2 staff members travelled to Oxford to stay at Brasenose College and to explore the city. During our time in Oxford, we witnessed an array of stunning buildings and the captivating architecture that resides in Oxford. One of these buildings was The Saxon Tower of St Michael at the North Gate (1040), where the door to the cell of the Bocardo Prison is still present in which Oxford Martyrs were imprisoned before their execution. The Palladian Radcliffe Camera (1737 – 1749) was directly on our doorstep from Brasenose College and was a popular location for photos. With its pillars and dome in a straightforward, symmetrical repeating pattern, the Radcliffe Camera captures Palladian architectural principles flawlessly. Another remarkable feature of Oxford is the English gothic Magdalen College Tower (1492-1509), which is a 44m high bell tower making it the tallest building in Oxford. The tower also plays an important role in Oxford life as a part of an ongoing tradition that is likely to date back to the tower's original construction, a choir sings from the top on May Morning while townspeople gather below. We also stayed at and explored Brasenose College, where we were given short academic talks by staff at the University in Psychology, History and even Pottery. Additionally, we had a tour of Worcester College, which was breath-taking due to its extensive gardens, a lake surrounded by sculptures and trees and a beautiful chapel with vibrant stained-glass windows and decorative pews.






















Whilst at Oxford, we were able to explore the city on our own but also with our teachers, which allowed us to experience the atmosphere of Oxford. In my opinion, the city is purely inspiring with its world-renowned university, beautiful architecture, and several large public parks. Education is, of course, a huge sector in Oxford with the university and numerous tutorial colleges. Still, there is also a thriving social scene with many trendy bars, restaurants, and independent shops, along with regular chain stores found in other British cities. As Oxford is built on the river Thames, there are large areas of the city which are not built on and this gives it a rural feeling. We also visited the Oxford University Museum of Natural History, home to over 7 million objects and 30,000 zoological-type specimens.

Overall, staying at Brasenose College was extremely enjoyable and allowed me and the other students to experience university accommodation, food and taster academic sessions that gave us a real feel and sense of what it is like to study at Oxford. I felt very welcomed by the staff and student ambassadors alike at both Brasenose College and Worcester College, which only made the experience more wonderful.


