FORTNIGHTLY HIGHLIGHTS

Dear Parents/Carers,

This half-term signals the start of the options processes in Years 8,9 and 11. The year 9 process was launched this week in an extended assembly and is followed by Parents' Evening on Tuesday 30th January; the year 8 process will be launched with students on the 7th February with Year 8 Parents' Evening on Thursday 22nd February. For both year groups, there will then be an in-person Options Evening on Wednesday 6th March where the aim is to provide as much information as possible, so that students can make good decisions about their next steps.

The same philosophy governs our whole "choices" programme – whether it be advice and guidance to students in years 8 and 9; support to year 11 students making decisions about post-16 education; sixth formers exploring their options for higher education through universities, apprenticeships, employment or gap years; or the wider careers and next steps inspiration, advice and guidance that covers all our students. The aim is to ensure that our students are wellinformed about their choices, so they can make the right decisions for them.

For year 11 students, Taster Day on Monday 29th January is an integral part of the options process as we welcome our Red Ties, as well as over 130 students from other schools, to have a taste of what it is like to be in the Sixth Form at IGS. All applicants will have the opportunity to sample lessons in the subjects they may choose for Post-16 and will experience the level of challenge which increases significantly from GCSE to A-Level. Subject choices and combinations may open up, as well as close off, the opportunities and pathways available to them when they leave school, so it is important that they are able to make informed decisions. Following Taster Day, the deadline for post-16 applications is Friday 9th February and student interviews will take place 27-29th February.

Over the last two weeks, we have enjoyed some excellent student success including in a wide range of sports. Details are provided in the sporting updates below. The winner of the IGS Battle of the Bands competition, "Shaded" have also competed in the Red Kite Alliance competition, featuring bands from schools across Leeds and North Yorkshire, at the Wardrobe in Leeds. It was a fantastic night of live music and we were very proud of our talented year 10 musicians who secured the audience's vote as the best band on the evening.

As many of our year 13 students are receiving offers from universities, conservatoires and for apprenticeships across the country, a record 13 students have been offered places at Oxford or Cambridge this year on a range of courses including History, Geography, Biochemical Science, Economics and Management, Physics, Languages, Natural Sciences and Maths. Applying to Oxbridge is always an extremely rigorous and character-testing experience and all students who put themselves forward for this process have demonstrated ambition, resilience and courage regardless of the final outcome. We look forward to sharing news of the full range of destinations and courses in due course.

Finally, we are also looking forward to our annual production of Grease which runs for 4 nights from Monday 5th February. Good luck to all of the students involved and a huge thank you to staff for making these events happen.

Rugby


- Yr7, 8s played away to PHGS on 16th Jan.

A polite reminder about pick up and drop off protocols

Ilkley Grammar School sent an all-star team of chemists to the 'Top of the Bench' competition on Wednesday.

This long running competition put on by the Royal Society of Chemistry at the impressive Chemistry Department at the University of York, attracts the best schools in the region and is very competitive. Winners of the Yorkshire heat go through to the nationals in Edinburgh later this year.

Our IGS students did a fantastic job, and I was proud to have them representing our school. They tackled the tasks logically and their teamwork was evident at all times. The winners of the day were Bradford Grammar School but in raw scores it was all very close. Above are some photos, and below are brief summaries of the tasks from each of the team members. Dr Marshall

Emelyn McCann (Year 11)

We first had 5 different written tasks to do together as a team. These involved some GCSE Chemistry but also general chemistry knowledge and skills such as memorisation and skim-reading. For example, we had 7 minutes to skim through the 'Chemistry Review' magazine and find as many answers to a set of questions as possible. We were also asked questions on the topic of water.

Luke Armstrong (Year 9)

Next, we had the task of launching a small rocket. Two reactants were combined with water and when the gas pressure had built up, the rocket would launch. Closest team to I minute delay wins! We therefore had to experiment to find the best combination of water and reactants, by finding the correct measurements of each substance. We carried out multiple test launches with the best one being 13 seconds away from the one-minute mark (47 seconds).

Ismail Mahboob (Year 9)

In the next practical challenge, we had to work out the relative densities of 4 coloured liquids! We had to do this by seeing which would float to the top. This task was difficult as some of the liquids would mix together and was hard to observe which liquid was denser.

Besty Burt (Year 10)

For our chromatography challenge we need to work out who the 'culprit' was by analysing their pen ink against suspect samples. This is a practical we do in Year 9 so we were confident setting up the equipment and allowing the dye to run until you could work out what different colours were in the mixture.



GR8 Minds Information for Schools

Ilkley Grammar School currently offers a GR8 Minds Children's Mental Health Service, which is an NHS service provider by Wharfedale, Airedale & Craven GP Alliance. https://www.wacalliance.co.uk

There is a clinic running alternate Thursdays and every Friday morning by Sharon Cope. Any pupils who wish to access the service, must make themselves known to the pastoral team, or Head of Year, who will then organise an appointment.

The team provide 1:1 support with a range of issues such as:

- stress and anxiety
- self-confidence and self-esteem
- exercise
- sleep
- education
- behavioural issues
- social support
- special needs
- long-term health conditions/disabilities
- bereavement
- family changes such as divorce or relationship breakdown

You may be seen by a qualified counsellor or a Social Prescribing Practitioner. At the end of the appointments, you may be encouraged to access specialist health care services or extra-curricular activities which can further support your health and wellbeing.














Red Kite Alliance Battle of the Bands - the Wardrobe, Leeds

It was a cold and icy night, but the **Wardrobe was the hottest venue in Leeds** as the groups and audience gathered for the first ever Red Kite Alliance Battle of the Bands on Thursday 18th January. In the autumn term, the participating schools selected, with some staging their own Battle of the Bands, the band that would represent their school at the final showdown at the Wardrobe.

The eleven bands battled it out in front of a judging panel including leading figures from the music industry. The judges were Simon Rix (Kaiser Chiefs, Holy Moly Management), Sally Bryant (A&R / Artist Manager, Dance To The Radio / Futuresound) and Sam Nicholls (aka whiskas – Music:Leeds / Launchpad).

While the judges deliberated the audience was treated to a further set played by Manchester band, Signifying Nothing, which included two Ilkley Grammar School alumni pupils, Edgar and Tom.

Every band was supported by friends, family and members of staff and the venue was packed out with people enjoying the atmosphere and cheering on their group.

There was a huge range of talent on display with groups singing songs ranging from classics by bands such as ABBA and Fleetwood Mac to Jamiroquai and even original songs from Year 10 students at Crawshaw Academy and A Level students at Guiseley School.

Every performer and group had won the opportunity to perform at a professional venue and in that sense it was an opportunity of a lifetime for all of them. It was the last band of the night to play, Yacht Club, made up of students Niamh, Eddie, Luke, Krisha and Lilia from Allerton Grange, that ultimately took the overall prize with their song 'Locked out of Heaven', which really got the crowd on their feet. Harrogate Grammar School took second place with particularly impressive vocal performances in 'Beggin' and Temple Moor High School took third with a heavy metal number 'Riskin' it all', with the musicians standing out for their stage presence.

It was Ilkley Grammar School that won the audience vote with their performance of The Chain by Fleetwood Mac described by one audience member as 'an absolute banger!'.

Perhaps one day all those who attended will look back, as people must do with the Kaiser Chiefs, and say 'I was there'. There was certainly a huge amount of talent on display from across all the schools. There are already plans for RK BOTB 2025 and it is exciting to think of what talent is waiting in the wings, ready to represent their school next year.
