"Through high-quality support and guidance, the overwhelming majority of students go on to further training or study, often at the most prestigious universities."

Ofsted, 2017

- 85-90% of students continue into Higher Education.
- 10-15% move on to apprenticeships or employment each year.
- Over the last 3 years on average 45% of applicants have obtained places at Russell Group
- 5% of students go on to study at Oxbridge or medicine-based courses annually.
- Since 2016, 20 students have progressed to Oxbridge.
- In 2020-21 just over 10% of applications have been submitted as part of the Apply+ programme (students applying to Oxbridge or to medical, veterinary or dental school.




