Poppies	 The far-reaching impact of conflict – a maternal viewpoint Explores the concept of internal conflict – dealing with grief
Jane Weir	
Kamikaze	 Explores the internal conflict a Kamikaze and his family faced The power of societal expectations The power of memories and the natural world
Beatrice Garland	
Exposure Wilfred Owen	 'Exposes' the bleak, monotonous reality of warfare – unlike propaganda Explores the futility of war – the mental and physical traumas caused (Owen died in WW1) Explores the power of nature as a punishing force over humanity
Remains Simon Armitage	 Explores the internal trauma caused by war (impact of PTSD) Explores a soldier attempting to mask his guilt
Charge of the Light Brigade Alfred Lord Tennyson	 A celebration of soldier's bravery in the Crimean war A controversial challenge to the power figures making 'blunders' Explores soldiers lack of identity – their enforced behaviours
War Photographer Carol Ann Duffy	 Explores human guilt – the photographer is torn between his job and his moral integrity Duffy (angrily) explores our indifference and lack of empathy for those in conflict
