

16-19 Tuition Fund 2021-22

Definition: Additional funding for one-year for schools, colleges and other 16 to 19 providers to mitigate the disruption to learning arising from coronavirus (COVID-19).

In line with the conditions of funding, this allocation of funds will be used to provide 1:1 and small group tuition for students who

- have not achieved a grade 4 or 5 in English and/or maths
- have a grade 4 or above in English and/or maths, are from an economically disadvantaged background and would need catch-up support. These are defined as students from the 27% most economically deprived areas of the country based on the index of multiple deprivation.

Identified students who meet the criteria, will be provided with additional support from subject experts to prepare them for GCSE exams in English Language and maths. To supplement the teaching which students receive in school as part of their curriculum, the money will be used to specifically fund:

• 1:1 or small group (maximum 3 students) private tuition with a local accredited provider (Kip McGrath) who will liaise with teachers at the school to share information in order to ensure maximum impact.

Records of the use of funding, with reference to individual students, the number of hours of tuition received and the tutors delivering the provision, will be maintained by the school in order to evidence the correct use of this funding.

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
