	A written study, relating to the practical portfolio of work. This should show critical understanding and be a minimum of 1000 words.	
	Personal response to given theme	
	A coursework unit consisting of a final piece or pieces accompanied by	
в	preliminary/supporting studies. Students will develop personal ideas linking to the theme and the exploration of related artists; leading onto design developments and the final piece.	
2	Component 2: Externally set assignment	
	The exam paper is released on 1 st February and preparatory work begins as soon as possible after this date. Students will develop personal ideas linking to the given theme and explore related artists. Following the preparatory period, students must complete 15 hours of unaided, supervised time and must produce a finished outcome or series of related finished outcomes informed by their preparatory work.

Component I: Personal Study Deadline: 31st January 2023 18 marks 15% of A-level

Component 2: Externally set Assignment Preparatory period + 15 hours supervised time 72 marks 40% of A-level

SUBJECT ENRICHMENT

Each year students from Years 12 and 13 visit London to visit major London Galleries and view important exhibitions such as the Turner Prize Shortlist. SUBJECT SPECIFIC ENTRY REQUIREMENT

Minimum of level 4 in Art (or related subject) at GCSE. Students who wish to pick the subject ab initio will be required to present a Portfolio of work to the Head of Department in the summer term prior to starting the course. Acceptance onto the course is dependent upon the portfolio of work.
