AIM

The Aim of both courses is to support progression towards higher education and employment in the health and social care sector. In preparation for life after sixth form, students will use cognitive and problemsolving skills in relation to service users with a range of needs. Furthermore, students' intrapersonal skills will be developed to ensure they can communicate effectively, work collaboratively and negotiate. In addition, students will develop personal skills such as self-management, adaptability and resilience. The skills developed are supported by the way the course is taught and assessed (coursework and exams), and also through the work experience placements organised as part of the course.
