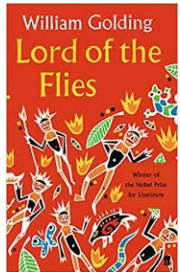

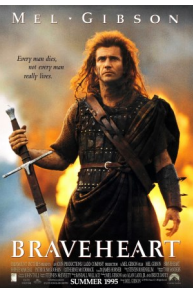

Written in stages between 1937 and 1949, The Lord of the Rings is one of the best-selling novels ever written, with over 150 million copies sold.

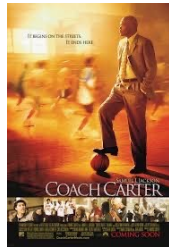

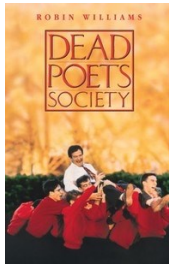

Julia Roberts stars in this legal drama based on the story of a woman who helped win the largest settlement ever paid in a direct-action lawsuit.



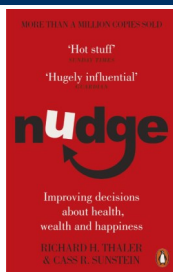

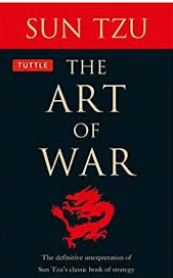

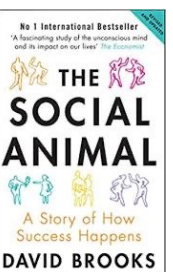

Range is a 2019 book by David Epstein in which he expands on the points from his previous book The Sports Gene to make a more general argument against overspecialization.

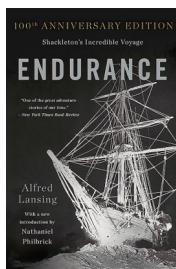
