Creative Arts

The Creative Arts team have been particularly busy over the past few weeks running theatre trips, a residential, and putting on concerts, in addition to rehearsing for upcoming events:

Our incredibly talented A Level and GCSE Music students put on a small concert for parents before October half term, to showcase and celebrate their exam performance work.

Over 80 students, forming the cast, crew and musicians, went to Ingleborough Hall on a rehearsal residential trip from Thursday 17th- Saturday 19th November. Students rehearsed tirelessly, in preparation for our school production of the Sound of Music. This will take place 7th- 9th February 2023.

40 students went to York theatre to see Frantic Assembly's version of Othello at the end of October, all from KS4-5 Drama/Performing Arts and Theatre Studies. 30 students from years 8-12 enjoyed a theatre trip to Charlie and The Chocolate Factory on 24th November.

Our Battle of the Bands took place on Thursday 24th November. This was a fantastic event with 8 bands from years 7-12, competing to be crowned the inaugural IGS Rock Heroes. There were prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd places, with the winning band, chosen by our independent panel of judges (including professional musicians and concert promoter who has worked with artists such as Ed Sheeran and Sam Fender), securing a professional recording session at The Woolpack studio in Otley.

Students in all years are currently rehearsing for our annual Countdown to Christmas, a concert which will take place in St. Margaret's Church on Monday 12th December, starting at 6.30pm.
