HEADTEACHER'S UPDATES

STRIKE ACTION:

As you may be aware from media coverage, the NEU (National Education Union) have declared national and regional strike action which is scheduled to take place on the following dates:

- Wednesday, I February
- Tuesday, 28 February
- Wednesday, 15 March
- Thursday, 16 March

The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the Government over teachers' pay, and not because of any issues at our school.

We are currently in the process of assessing the impact which strike action may have and considering different options, but NEU members have the legal right to not disclose whether they intend to strike which makes advanced planning difficult. We are aware that the NEU is the largest teaching union at IGS with significant membership and, therefore, strike action is likely to necessitate at least partial closure.

In the interim, I would ask that you be mindful of the strike dates and, if necessary, make childcare arrangements. We will communicate the plans in full as soon as possible and will, of course, prioritise places for vulnerable students.

I apologise in advance for any disruption to students' education.

Ofsted Visit: 19th and 20th January 2023

Thank you for your support during our recent ungraded Ofsted inspection. Throughout the two days, our staff and students really did the school proud and the small inspection team positively commented on a wide range of strengths, our summary of which is below:

- The ambition and sequencing of the curriculum across the subjects inspected in depth maths, English, science and business
- Expert subject knowledge and pedagogy of teachers
- Some highly effective use of Showbie to enable independence and review of learning.
- The ambition for SEND, careers and Post-16
- Students feel well supported. They feel safe and know how to stay safe.
- In lessons, students were focused and engaged and "with their teachers". Overall, they were polite, courteous and well mannered.
- There is a healthy respect for difference and a culture of tolerance.
- Student leadership is very strong and students are really positive about the range of experiences on offer.
- Leaders' positive engagement with staff over workload.

As you are probably aware, we are not able to share the outcome until all quality assurance checks have been completed and the school receives the final letter from the Lead Inspector - this process is likely to take several weeks.

Whilst Ofsted does not dictate the work that we do at IGS, we do welcome their feedback and do try to positively use the inspection framework as a force for further improvement. We will share their written feedback (this will take the form of a short letter) in due course.
