#### **FORTNIGHTLY HIGHLIGHTS**

Dear Parent/Carers,

It has been a wonderful (and, for the first few days, very warm!) start to the new academic year as we have welcomed back familiar faces, as well as our new year 7 "Purple Ties", new year 12 students and those who have transferred to IGS from other schools. They have settled quickly into learning and routines, engaging with their teachers, and, after the first full week, students have already collectively achieved 29,286 positives. Well done!

In our assemblies on the first day, we spoke about the Personal Best values which underpin the culture of the school: Respect, Courage, Responsibility, Kindness, Resilience and Pride. In particular, we reminded students that there are lots of reasons to take Pride in being an IGS student: outstanding academic achievement and support; record levels of sporting success; a wide range of extra-curricular and enrichment activities including numerous opportunities for live performance and competition at local, regional and even national level; opportunities for discovery and adventure in the UK and abroad; as well as being able to make a positive difference to the lives of others in line with our school vision. Over the last two years, we have raised over £27,000 for various charities selected by our students from Children In Need, Marie Curie, LS29, Guide Dogs UK, Yorkshire Brain Tumour Research and Pakistan Flood Relief and this continues to be an important part of our work.

Students were also asked to think positively about what they would do to demonstrate their Personal Best this year, including the importance of taking responsibility and getting involved by maximising all of the opportunities and support available both in the classroom and beyond.

The return to school was also tinged with sadness as staff and students in years 8-13 remembered Mrs Janet Buckley, teacher of geography and a form tutor at IGS for almost 23 years who tragically died in the summer. As expected, the students have been hugely respectful, recognising her professionalism and contribution to the school over two decades. Thank you to the many parents/carers who have sent in the messages of condolence. In order for these to be passed on to the family, we have opened up a virtual book of condolence for students and parents/carers – please see the details in the additional feature below.

Please note, Mrs Buckley's funeral is on Tuesday 19th September and, whilst school will be open as normal, there will be some disruption to lessons as a number of colleagues are attending the service.

As I mentioned to the students, Mrs Buckley was a consummate professional who was very proud to be a teacher at IGS. She would have wanted all students to work hard, try their best, show respect, kindness, courage, resilience, and responsibility and challenge themselves to aim high and fulfil their potential. ## Personal Development at IGS: 2023-24: Jamie Gutch, Deputy Headteacher





All parents/carers of students in years 7-13 have access to the Personal Development folder on Showbie which is where resources for the year are stored and where all students will store documents related to their Personal Development. Students in all year groups have completed a Personal Development reflection and target setting activity at the start of the year and will be encouraged over the coming weeks to sign up to the range of extra-curricular and leadership opportunities on offer. You can support this process by discussing these opportunities with your child. We know that developing a rich range of skills and experiences over time (growing the whole person) alongside strong academic progress is what gives our students the edge in what is an increasingly competitive world.

In December all students will be completing their first Personal Development self-report. Students (except those in exam groups) will also complete an update in the summer term.
