Our 3-year ALPS score of 1 places IGS in the top 10% of all schools nationally for progress from GCSE to A-level.

In 2023, 73% will progress to university, 67% in 2023, with a further 6% deferring entry for 2024. 10 students secured university places at Oxford or Cambridge. Other students have successfully gone on to apprenticeships, employment or further training.

- 3 X BTEC/A Level + Enrichment (EPQ, WEx, Sports Leaders) Best suited to those with an average of grade 5 at GCSE. Regular coursework assessment and fewer final exams.
- **4 A Level subjects** only recommended for students averaging around a grade 7 at GCSE and considering a highly competitive degree course / or blue chip company apprenticeship.

SUBJECT ILEADER Open to all Y12 wanting to gain skills and experiences to aid university

Represent a subject at Open Evenings, promote the subject you love to other students in the wider community, support subject staff and run interventions or create display boards for corridors and classroom. Check the Subject iLeader Department List to see if your chosen subject is offering this role.

MODEL UNITED NATIONS HEAD ILEADERS

Open to all students with an interest in global issues and politics but also for those who are organised, diligent and can work well as a team. This role would require you to work alongside our existing MUN Head iLeaders, to set up and run prep sessions once a fortnight, as well as conventions each half-term.

SSAT Accreditation can be awarded Lead Staff: Mr Mills and Mrs Shah

MODEL UNITED NATIONS

This is open to all students, and especially to those with an interest in global issues and politics. Students will meet once a fortnight to discuss current global issues over their choosing, and work towards a school convention each half-term. At conventions students will act as delegates and represent a country from around the world. After conventions follow-up activities such as contacting local media outlets and MPs will take place. Students will work alongside those from other years and will develop their organisational, communication and public speaking skills through this project. Lead staff: Mr Mills and Mrs Shah

KS3 DRAMA SUBJECT SUPPORT ILEADER

We are looking for students who would like to work in Year 7 or 8 Drama lessons to support the teaching of Drama. You will work alongside the teacher to support students' practical and writing skills in Drama.

You will need to commit to two lessons per cycle which will be organised around your timetable.

In your application you need to write about what skills you feel you can bring to this role and why you are applying for it. Accreditation through the SSAT can be awarded. Lead Staff: Ms Ramrattan

MENTAL HEALTH CHAMPIONS

Open to everyone who would like to learn the skills and confidence to spot the signs of mental health issues in others as well as offer guidance towards the support they need. In doing so, you can speed up people's recovery and help stop a mental health issue from getting worse. You won't be a therapist, but we will teach you to listen, reassure, and respond, even in a crisis - and even potentially stop a crisis from happening.

We also aim to give you the information and skills to look after your own mental health so that you can set an example for others. By giving you the tools to have these conversations, we hope to empower you to create a mentally healthy, supportive environment in your family, school, peer group, or community. A full accreditation from Mental Health England is offered to students from Mental Health England

Mental Health Champions are a key strand of the program for Year 12. These iLeaders will have a real opportunity to help construct a community in Ilkley Grammar School where people feel able to talk openly about their mental health and are aware of the opportunities available to them in terms of support and building resilience. Champions will be working on outreach through PBT and Assemblies as well as putting together activities and sessions for a whole school Mental Health and Wellbeing week. Lead Staff: Mr N Adams

Do you have pride in your local community? Are you a kind citizen who wants to help others? Do you want to encourage respect and improve the community around you? The community iLeader role would be a fantastic opportunity for you. As a community iLeader you would have responsibility for organising charitable contributions and/or general awareness raising of causes. Last year we collected winter coats for refugees, attended climate action fairs, helped with the clean water in Ilkley campaign and assisted at Nell Bank and the Colour Rush. These are by no means the only opportunities as we are looking for your ideas. The community iLeader will fit around you as you can be involved with the events of your choosing. There is no weekly meeting, but we will meet occasionally to go through opportunities and brainstorm. If you have any ideas on how to change the community and the wider world, this is the iLeader position for you!

DRAMA/THEATRE STUDIES AMBASSADOR

We are looking for students who can promote the importance of Drama/Theatre Studies at various events for parents and students lower down the school. You will need to be a positive role model who can foster a love of the art form. You will talk to students and parents about the importance of the subject, how it relates to everyday life as well as the world of performance. You will be involved in Open Evenings and talks with students as well as creating promotional displays/materials.

DRAMA/THEATRE STUDIES SUBJECT MENTOR

We are looking for students who can work either one-to-one or with small groups of <u>either</u> Yr11 Drama GCSE students or Yr10 BTEC Performing Arts students. You will come into a minimum of two Drama/Performing Arts lessons across the cycle. In the GCSE Yr11 lessons you will work with the student(s) to support and boost their acting skills for their Text Performances and their ability to write about 'Blood Brothers' and write a Theatre Review for their written exam. Ilkley Leaders: leaders of the future

Open to students in Year 7-13 who have a real passion for PE and Sport. This role will involve being a representative for PE and Sport within your year group. Members of the Sports Council will be expected to attend half-termly meetings, assist in the planning and leadership of events such as Sports Presentation Evening and Sports Day and assist the PE department with any tasks or duties. Traditionally, the members of the Sports Council are involved in creating a fundraising project each academic year, with great success raising thousands of pounds for both IGS PE and chosen charities. Lead staff: Mr Ewbank

MUSIC ILEADER: TECHNICIAN

The ideal candidate for this role will be able to re-string and tune guitars/bass guitars and ukuleles. You will be required to check keyboards/electric pianos and amplifiers and report any faults to Music Staff. Headphone maintenance may be required from time to time. We would require one lesson per cycle and perhaps the flexibility to assist at live concerts/events in school. (suitable for KS4 or 5 student)

ANTI-BULLYING ILEADER

A leadership opportunity for students who have experience in antibullying to support student feeling threatened or uncomfortable but reluctant to speak to an adult. You will have to offer advice, support and strategies.

CREATIVE WRITING CLUB LEAD STUDENT

For the role of Creative Writing Club Lead Student, we would require you to be passionate about creative writing and English to help lead and manage the club. You will need proficient skills in spelling, punctuation and grammar as well as listening skills. When at one of our writing meets, you would need to curate prompts for the students to work on, be a positive and inspiring role model for younger students who are looking to develop their creative skill and be willing to constructively challenge members of the club to help hone their craft. You may also be involved in organising creative writing competitions for students along with attending and facilitating the club meeting each Thursday on week B. Lead Staff: Miss Reid

STEM CHALLENGE ILEADER

Come help support and guide our Y7 and Y8 students on Thursday lunch times in their STEM club. Activities include rocket building, fire writing, making bouncing bubbles and helping them with their own projects for the Summer Science Fair. If you're keen, you can even plan some fun science activities yourselves to do with the students! This iLeader role is open to students in Y12 and Y13 and it will run on a rota system (in other words, you won't have to do it every week but a few times a term).

DANCE ILEADER

We are looking for someone to run Dance Club which will be open to all students of all dancing ability. The successful applicant will choreograph dances in a range of styles and run the club. There will be the opportunity to get dances ready to perform at various events and showcases, as well as the potential to receive an accreditation for the role. Lead staff: Miss Holgate

FRONT OF HOUSE ILEADER

An exciting opportunity open to students in Y7-13 to be a member of the Front of House team for music events this year. This role will involve greeting, ushering and looking after the audience at public music events (e.g., Battle of the Bands, Christmas Concert). The Front of House team will meet once per half term and must be available to attend evening music events in the school calendar. This role would suit students that are interested in developing skills and learning how to run music events.

MUSIC ILEADER: LUNCHTIME CLUB/CLASSROOM ASSISTANT

We are looking for Sixth Form students to assist with our wide and varied lunchtime club offer. Please tailor your application to the club you think will match your expertise/experience. For example, if you love singing and have experience perhaps you could apply to support at Choir and maybe run sectional rehearsals or the warm-up section. As Y12 have early lunch, we would also like the opportunity to ask students to support in music lessons that fit with your timetable. Lead Staff: Mrs Chapman

LIBRARY ILEADERS

All meetings will take place Tuesday week B 3.15 – 3.45 The role of the library iLeaders will be to lead in publicity for World Book Day (7th March), to promote Y7 Readathon ((11-15 March) and to continuously update the display boards both inside and outside the library according to the 'important dates' list which will be discussed with them.

Leadership will be given in all areas by the librarian, but students will be expected to organise themselves into groups and make decisions (with the agreement of the librarian) for all these tasks. Attendance at most meetings will be an expectation of the role. Lead staff: Ms Harrison

OLICANA SCHOLARS ILEADER

If you have a passion for English, this is definitely something for you! Olicana Scholars is a new and exciting project launching within the English department. We want students to be curious beyond their English lessons, develop research skills and foster a community of scholars, not just students. Olicana Scholars will involve students completing independent research and engagement with texts, videos, articles, art, music and much more linked with the units they study in English from Y7 to Y9. This will help students become more independent, ready for GCSE.

You will be required to dedicate at least one period a cycle to this role. You can choose whether you want KS3 or KS4. POST-16 ENGLISH ACADEMIC MENTOR

Considering teaching, coaching or working with young people as a future career? Looking for an opportunity to prove commitment to society for a UCAS application? This role will involve you being an 'English Academic Mentor' to one of our new Y11 cohort. You will meet with them on a regular basis to:

- Improve self-efficacy and resilience.

-Model from a peer perspective how to best unlock their potential. - Equip students with resources and strategies to further unlock independent study.

 Assist with planning / organisation of their English revision.
 Monitor engagement and progress, evaluate impact and plan strategies

You will be given training so that you understand the best ways to support them.

HEAD STUDENT

Lead P16 SLT and Student Council, represent the school at Open Evenings and Red Kite Alliance events. Attend staff leadership meetings to act as a vital link between staff and students. An outstanding opportunity to develop skills and strengthen your leadership experience.

P16 STUDENT LEADERSHIP TEAM

Get your voice heard in school and discuss important P16 and wider school issues. Work with younger year groups to provide support as directed by Heads of Year, promote excellence across the school by supporting staff both in lessons and around school. - Graphic design

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





- Post-18 Destination data shows that in 2023 around 73% of students will continue their studies in Higher Education by September 24.
- Around 6% move on to apprenticeships or employment.
- In 2023 43% of university applicants obtained places at Russell Group Universities (76 students in 2022) with 16% taking a Gap Year.
- I0 students achieved offers to study at Oxbridge and achieved the grades in 2023
- Oxbridge and medicine-based courses annually made up 5% in 2023 (in both 2021 and 2022), This is a total of 67 students since 2016.
