

# Marshall Building: What's on Where?



Technology: Textiles EI	Year 13 students will be producing designs, modelling techniques, and illustrating ideas for their non-exam assessment. Previous GCSE and A Level outcomes and portfolios will be available to view. Year 9 will be on hand to help create recycled polymer bookmarks to take away.


