PERSONAL BEST



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A WORLD CLASS CURRICULUM

It is our mission to provide a world class curriculum for all, giving our students access to “powerful knowledge” which promotes academic excellence, deepens understanding and enables them to have the luxury of choice for their futures.

Learning is carefully sequenced to allow students to know more and do more, and our approaches are underpinned by the principles of cognitive science in order to support retention and recall and ‘make learning stick’.

All students have a balanced and challenging curriculum, which provides strong academic foundations with the flexibility to tailor provision to meet students’ needs. There is a genuine commitment to personalisation which can be seen through the range of options and pathways at all levels. This includes our bespoke year 9 curriculum which allows the opportunity to study new courses in computer science, business, philosophy and law, alongside specialist technology, creative arts, PE and additional language options. This broadens students’ learning experiences and helps them to make informed decisions for GCSE and beyond.

We have the highest expectations of all and provide an outstanding education, which is enhanced by extensive extra-curricular opportunities, to support all students to achieve their Personal Best. We develop students through our ‘Personal Development’ programme where our students learn about community, leadership and tolerance. Our curriculum leads to exceptional levels of achievement, growth and positive, memorable experiences which last a lifetime.


ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AND OUTSTANDING PROGRESS

Many Ilkley Grammar School students reach outstanding academic standards and this is reflected in exceptional examination results at GCSE and A-level and strong rates of progression to competitive courses at top universities across the country. Despite a return to harsher, pre-pandemic grading standards our students continue to excel at GCSE with highlights in 2024 including:

- Over 20% of all GCSE grades awarded at the highest grades 9-8
- Over 37% of GCSE grades awarded at 7-9 (equivalent to the old A/A*)
- 35 students achieved grades 7-9 in all 9 or 10 of their qualifications
- An overall pass rate across all qualifications of over 99%.

Whilst we are very proud of this continued level of success, what is most important to us is the strong progress that students make, regardless of their ability. All students are encouraged and challenged to fulfil their potential and achieve the very best grades of which they are capable.

Our commitment to achievement and aspiration for all can be seen in our significantly positive progress scores which consistently place IGS amongst the leading comprehensive schools in the country. Indeed, in 2024, our progress score for all students, including students with Special Educational Needs, is estimated to be in excess of +.5. This will again place IGS in the highest “well above average” category in line with the top 15% of all state schools nationally, including selective schools. As a result, we have an excellent reputation, not only within our local community but also across the wider Leeds and Bradford regions.

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A SUPPORTIVE, SAFE AND CARING ENVIRONMENT

Underpinning the academic excellence and culture of high expectations is an outstanding pastoral care system. We are committed to maintaining a school climate where every child has their well-being and mental health needs supported by a designated pastoral leader and a wide-ranging support team which includes the form tutor. 100 members of Ilkley Grammar

School staff are Mental Health First Aid trained and we also have specialist counselling on site through our in-school counsellors. High standards of behaviour and safety are in evidence across the school and students are supportive of each other and the wider community.

At Ilkley Grammar School, we offer a range of interventions and personalised learning strategies to ensure that students enjoy exceptional, inclusive experiences. Interventions range from individual 'One Plans' informing teachers of students' specific needs to support quality first teaching strategies that are responsive to need, to in-class support and targeted interventions. Where a student's needs have an impact on their learning, we work in collaboration to identify and respond through time-bound interventions such as literacy, numeracy and dyslexia support. Our inclusive learning hub and nurture centre provide holistic support for students who, at times, require a smaller and more nurturing environment and they offer a safe space and retreat as required for students with Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs.

In September 2019, we opened our School-Led Resource Provision (SRP) for students with an EHCP for an Autistic Spectrum Disorder and associated needs. Our resource provision is used to support students to achieve in mainstream, develop a range of personal skills in preparation for adulthood and to receive targeted interventions that are detailed within their EHCPs. Due to demand for specialist places across the Wharfe Valley, Bradford Metropolitan District Council (BMDC) have recently funded a capital expansion to increase the SRP to a 24-place provision.

OUTSTANDING PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

The range of Personal Development opportunities on offer at IGS is vast, making school life more meaningful, substantial and rewarding, whilst also preparing students for the future.

Ilkley Grammar School students have access to a wealth of enrichment opportunities. This includes an extensive and popular extra-curricular sports programme which encompasses rugby, football, hockey, cross-country, netball, dance, gymnastics, cricket and tennis, as well as opportunities to compete at regional and national level. We also have extensive opportunities in the creative arts. The music department run junior and senior choirs and orchestras, a jazz band, a samba band, chamber groups, guitar and ukulele clubs, a composing club, and pop and rock bands for students of all ages and abilities. These groups also have the opportunity for live performances in concerts such as the Christmas Concert, Spring Concert, Creative Arts Festival, IGS Showcase at the Kings Hall, Battle of the Bands, weekly lunchtime concerts and gig-style 'band nights' once a term. A team of ten peripatetic teachers also deliver instrumental and vocal tuition on an individual or paired basis.

In addition, the drama department run two key stage 3 drama clubs, a musical theatre group, the Backstagers group, a devising club and there is an annual school production which in 2025 is 'Les Misérables'. The art and photography department run themed lunchtime groups, such as origami and print making, as well as seasonal groups like pumpkin carving and Christmas card making. There are also opportunities to get involved in stage set painting, alongside prop and costume making for the school production.

Whether it is developing public speaking skills through participation in external competitions such as Youth Speaks or by harnessing in-house expertise through clubs designed to develop more specialist interests such as coding, strategy games or creative writing, there is a huge amount on offer to cater for all students. All students have the opportunity to develop their individual talents and staff are on hand to share their enthusiasm and to develop potential.

Every year, students of all ages enjoy participation and success in national competitions such as Debating Matters; the National Foreign Language Spelling Bee; the UKMT maths challenges; Cyberfirst; the Physics Olympiad; a range of opportunities run by the Royal Society of Chemistry including the Chemistry Olympiad, 'Top of the Bench' and Schools' Analyst competitions; technology competitions run by the Rotary Club and many more.

Personal Development opportunities are organised into 8 interconnecting categories which include 'Active Citizenship and Community', 'Next Steps and Careers', 'Leadership and Influence', 'Health and Wellbeing' and 'Respect, Equality and Diversity'; these are shared with students and parents via the learning platform Showbie. Opportunities are also promoted at the highly popular Student Leadership and Enrichment Fayre early in the autumn term.

The clubs, activities and competitions on offer enable students to widen their horizons, build friendships and share experiences with each other in a more informal setting.

DISCOVERY AND ADVENTURE

Our students' academic life is enriched by a wide range of opportunities in which they explore and enjoy the world around them.

MEMORIES TO LAST A LIFETIME

Educational trips enhance studies beyond the classroom, making learning enjoyable and relevant. We run popular excursions to Iceland, Naples and the Belgium Battlefields, as well as foreign exchanges with schools in Coutances (Normandy) and Madrid. Sporting experiences range from visiting Wimbledon, netball and rugby tours and skiing in Europe or America. Equally, there is the opportunity to take advantage of numerous theatre, art and fieldwork trips, both locally and further afield.

In addition, we offer transformative experiences through the Duke of Edinburgh awards which help to develop communication skills, confidence, leadership and teamwork. For older students, we also work in partnership with World Challenge to provide opportunities which are simply extraordinary. In 2024, students completed a two-week expedition to the island of Borneo to contribute to wildlife conservation and, in 2025, they will experience an African adventure in Eswatini and Kruger National Park. These opportunities, financed by student fundraising, provide powerful life-changing experiences.

CHALLENGE AND CELEBRATION WEEK: A UNIQUE END OF YEAR REWARD

To reward students for a hard year's work, IGS is unique in offering a week-long programme of activities which specifically cater for each year group. Year 7 enjoy a varied programme from sailing adventures to visits to local attractions and a theme park. Year 8 visit the sights and shows of London, whilst Year 9 step outside their comfort zone, embracing outdoor challenges at a residential activity centre in an area of outstanding natural beauty. There is also a carousel of local day trips as an alternative for students in Key Stage 3. Students in year 10 enjoy a day of celebration before a one-week work experience placement to better understand the world of work, build resilience and self-confidence. This opportunity is also repeated in year 12, although there are also trips to Switzerland, Poland, Paris, Rome and Berlin, as well as opportunities to assist the key stage 3 trips as iLeaders.

LEADERSHIP AND INFLUENCE

The importance of developing students as leaders is fully embedded across the school through our unique iLeader programme which promotes over 30 leadership roles annually. Students have many opportunities for their voices to be heard through student questionnaires, tutor group representation and the Student Council. We see leadership potential in all of our students and the wealth of opportunities that we provide ensure students develop into confident and well-rounded individuals.

At Ilkley Grammar School we aim to develop leaders of today and of the future, actively encouraging students to take up positions of responsibility from their first year of secondary school. There is a huge range of student leadership experiences available across all key stages with groups such as the anti-bullying ambassadors who in 2020 published 'Respect' an anthology of creative writing and essays with contributions from students and celebrities including Simon Armitage, Alastair Campbell and Michael Rosen.

The influential post-16 Student Leadership Team (SLT) is led by three Head Students and seven deputies, each of whom are attached to a year group. Once appointed, our post-16 Student Leadership Team receives 'Leadership in Action' training and attends a bi-annual conference as part of the Red Kite Alliance to share best practice in student leadership.

We develop academic leaders through the debating society, iReaders and subject iLeaders who provide intervention and support to small groups of younger students. There is also a range of arts iLeaders including Backstagers who take responsibility for the technical and operational side of productions and concerts. In line with our commitment to supporting students' mental health, we also have student Mental Health iLeaders who receive accredited Mental Health First Aid training to equip them to provide appropriate peer-to-peer support.

Sports Leaders coach in-school teams and also link with primary schools to encourage participation and future sporting excellence. The long-established Student Council, incorporating representatives from each year group, ensures that our students have lots of opportunities to share their opinions and experiences of their education, as well as propose suggestions for improvement and genuinely have their voices heard. Their feedback, ideas and solutions help to make Ilkley Grammar School not only outstanding, but a special place to learn and achieve.

PREPARATION FOR A SUCCESSFUL FUTURE

Post-16 is the culmination of the whole school experience and we pride ourselves on the rich and personalised support that we offer our students during this exciting and challenging stage of their lives.

Students and staff have a proven track record of working together to achieve great success. Post-16 was officially graded as Outstanding as part of our Ofsted inspection in 2017 and since then outcomes have continued to improve alongside a significant year-on-year growth in numbers, attracting students from across the region including those transferring from private and selective schools, as well as The Skipton Academy, one of our partner schools within Moorlands Learning Trust.

The grades our students achieve are consistently significantly higher than national figures. For example, in 2024 35% of all grades were A/A*, 65% were at grades A*-B and 85% at A*-C. These outcomes create exceptional opportunities for our students, many of whom progress to varied and exciting destinations. These include Oxbridge (a record 12 students successfully achieved their offers in 2024, following 10 students in 2023) and Russell Group universities, studying on competitive courses such as medicine, dentistry, veterinary science, law and engineering, as well as securing higher level apprenticeships at some of the country's most reputable companies (including, for example, Rolls Royce, PwC, Deloitte and Morrisons).

We offer outstanding teaching delivered by expert and inspirational staff, specialist pastoral care and an extremely wide range of over 30 academic and vocational courses which enable all students to flourish. This is also complemented by an exciting range of personal development and enrichment opportunities including sports leadership qualifications, work experience, a plethora of leadership opportunities, the highly personalised Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), a post-16 discussion group and access to an impressive range of visiting speakers through the *iTalks* and *Cutting Edge* programmes.


