THE CORE CURRICULUM AT KS4

All students will spend nearly 60% of their timetable on the core curriculum. This will lead to 5 GCSE qualifications in:

GCSE ENGLISH LANGUAGE (Graded 9 to 1) GCSE ENGLISH LITERATURE (Graded 9 to 1) GCSE MATHEMATICS (Graded 9 to 1) GCSE COMBINED SCIENCE*: TRILOGY (WORTH 2 GCSEs graded 9-1) *unless taking GCSE Separate Science as one of your options which leads to 3 separate science qualifications

Core PE, RE and PSHE are not accredited courses.

Open Options 3 and 4 2 further choices from a range of options. To ensure you follow a broad and balanced curriculum we recommend one of your choices should be a practical/creative subject.

The English Baccalaureate



This is not a new qualification in itself but recognises students achieving 6 GCSE grades 9-5 in the above academic subjects.

It is a traditional, academic pathway and is recommended for <u>most of our learners</u>, especially those who are considering further and higher education.

Students will already access the English, mathematics and science element of the Ebacc through the compulsory core.

Qualifications that are classed as science are GCSE Combined Science, GCSE Separate Science in biology, chemistry and physics, Computer Science.

Only GCSE History and GCSE Geography are recognised as Humanities subjects.

Modern Foreign Languages (French and Spanish) are available as an option. We have always advised students that the continuation of a language is highly recommended.

The English Baccalaureate combination is appropriate for a most IGS students

The English Baccalaureate

"We acknowledge that certain academic subjects studied at A-level are more valued by Russell Group universities than others. The EBacc is founded on that university-based curriculum."

What the Department for Education (DfE) says:

The English Baccalaureate is a measure of success in core academic subjects. These are subjects most likely to be required or preferred for entry to degree courses and ones that will keep the most doors open

"It is also a benchmark for universities to check that applicants have a solid academic foundation on which to build."

A study by the UCL Institute of Education shows that studying subjects included in the EBacc provides students with greater opportunities in further education and increases the likelihood that a pupil will stay on in full-time education. Sutton Trust research reveals that studying the EBacc can help improve a young person's performance in English and maths.

 The English Baccalaureate is a core set of academic subjects which are shown to enhance pupils' chances of progressing onto further study

The government intends that at least 90% of pupils in mainstream secondary schools will enter the EBacc.

Pupils must study the key English Baccalaureate (EBacc) subjects of English, maths, science, history or geography, and a language at GCSE. This will make sure that pupils get the rigorous academic education they need to succeed - whether that is getting a place at university, starting an apprenticeship, or finding their first job.

Why is an EBacc Subject Choice Compulsory?

Option 1: EBACC CHOICE

 ... so that all students have 6 more traditional "academic" qualifications as is strongly recommended in today's educational and economic climate.

2) ... to keep options open post-16. All the EBacc subjects, with the exception of computer science, are what has been previously known as the "facilitating subjects" at A-level (subjects which are highly valued by many universities and will allow students a wider range of degree courses from which to select). Russell Group universities still value a language for example, but there's no entry requirement of this qualification for these universities.

PATHWAYS AT IGS SUPPORTED Pathway

4: Supported Pathway

Guided Option 1: Functional Skills English

This course is designed to develop written and verbal communication, and students can have the opportunity to gain additional qualifications such as Functional Skills English as part of this option. More generally, this option works in parallel with GCSE English and provides students with additional practice and literacy support. Students taking the Functional Skills option continue to work towards their GCSE English and English literature in their core English lessons. Students are assessed through an ongoing process for Functional Skills. It is delivered in a small group environment through the Inclusive Learning Department. There is opportunity for careers guidance as part of this course.

Guided Options 2 and 3

2 choices from BTEC/technical qualifications, and a range of practical/creative subjects.

Open Option 4 Open choice from a range of subjects.

WJEC AWARD IN HOSPITALITY AND CATERING

- This is a recent level 2 qualification equivalent to grades 4-8.5

BTEC IN PERFORMING ARTS

- This is a BTEC level 2 course
- ✤ It is worth the equivalent to one GCSE (grades 4-8.5)

BTEC Level 2 Tech Award in Sport

- This is a BTEC level 2 course (a new qualification running this year)
- It is different from GCSE PE (this includes less practical elements but 2 components of `internal assessment', so fewer exams)
- This is equivalent to one GCSE (grades 4-8.5)

SEPARATE SCIENCE

- Select extra science as one of your options (6 extra lessons in addition to your lessons in the core)
- ✤ It will result in a qualification in 3 separate sciences: GCSE Biology, GCSE Chemistry, GCSE Physics

- * You can progress to A-level sciences without having studied Separate Science.

XDon't make choices based on the fact that you like your current teacher. We will not be able to tell you who will be teaching you next year.

X Don't choose a course based on what your friends are doing.

X Don't assume some courses will be easier than others – all require hard work and homework.

X Don't choose before studying the booklet, gaining more information and attending the year 9 Options Evening

 \checkmark Consider what might be your future career but remember most people change their minds. It is best to aim as high as possible. Don't close doors for yourself.

 \checkmark Make sure you understand what each subject involves. New subjects may look attractive at first glance. You may think you know what an 'old' subject involves. Read the booklet.

\checkmark Be realistic/honest with yourself.

Remember it is very difficult to make changes once you have submitted your forms and it is virtually impossible from September.
