In this week of commemoration, we've said goodbye to our year 11 and 13 students as they begin their study leave and prepare for their upcoming GCSE, BTEC, A-Level and Level 3 Applied examinations.

As is tradition at IGS, our year 13 students returned to B:Hall for one final gathering, dressed in their old year 11 uniforms, now a little shorter but a lot more nostalgic. The morning was filled with laughter, heartfelt speeches and brilliant performances from some of our most talented students, including renditions of "That's Life", "Northern Attitude", "Tequila" and "Married with Children". It was a positive celebration of the journey they've taken at Post-16 as they leave us as confident, capable and compassionate young adults. We could not be prouder. # School Rebuilding Programme Update: Planning Approval Granted for New Teaching Block and Sports Complex



We are pleased to confirm that planning approval has been granted for the redevelopment of Ilkley Grammar School, including the construction of a new teaching block and state-of-the-art sports complex. This major investment forms part of the Department for Education's national School Rebuilding Programme, through which Ilkley Grammar was selected in 2022 as one of the schools most in need of significant rebuild and refurbishment.

The new facilities will be truly transformational, replacing buildings that are nearing the end of their lifespan with

modern, inspiring spaces that support high-quality teaching and learning. The development will also include a new sports hall, two activity studios and swimming pool, promoting physical health and wellbeing, and providing a valuable resource for the wider community. Designed with sustainability in mind, the new teaching block will be net-zero in operation, reflecting a strong commitment to environmental responsibility.















Construction is due to begin after the exam period in July 2025. Ahead of this, several slit trenches will be excavated and made good again over the May half-term break to allow further investigation of existing services.



We will continue to keep parents and carers updated as this exciting project progresses. Thank you for your continued support.











### First place at Cambridge Fitzwilliam College Translation Competition!



# How will the auction work?

### 1. Fill out an artwork submission formhttps://forms.office.com/e/uC8fNxk7bu

- Name, title, medium, size and guide price and confirming (if required) that you have permission to donate.
- All artw ork donated must be suitable for a school environment.

### 2. Deliver artwork by Friday<sup>th</sup>6June

- Students/staff Deliver the artwork to Mrs Harris in her Art room on A Floor
- Parents/carers Deliver the artwork to IGS reception

### 3. Exhibition and cataloguing of work

- Work will be exhibited in B8 during each of the Creative Arts Evenings (1st, 2nd, 3rd July) and will then be available online via Galabid
- Work will be catalogued on the Galabid website, and each artwork will have its own unique QR code to makebidding easy.

### 4. Bidding for artworks

- This will be a 'silent auction' using the online bidding platform Galabid.
- Parents/carers will need to sign up to the online platform to participate full instructions will be provided
- · Students can only bid via a parent/carer
- Parents/carers can make a bid in person at the launch event on the evening of the 1st July and online bidding will remain open until the 10th July.
- · A bid will be a commitment to buy the artwork at that price if yours is the highest bid
- The online portal will always show the latest bid.
- The auction will close on the 10<sup>th</sup> of July after which time successful bidders will be informed, and payment requested.

### 5. Payment and pick up

- You will be notified if your bid is successful, and an invoice will be generated automatically
- There will be a small 1.2% charge payable to Stripe which will be automatically included in your bid.
- There will also be the option to 'tip' Galabid' to support the running of the platform.
- There will be the usual payment options available on the Galabid platform (e.g. Visa, mastercard etc.)
- Artworks will be available for collection from Reception from the 10 July once payment has been made.
