



Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back after the May half-term break.

As we enter the final half-term of the academic year, I wanted to take the opportunity to reflect on both national developments and our own school community at IGS.

The increase in funding for education announced in this week's Spending Review is a welcome step in the right direction. However, as highlighted in a recent report by [SecEd](#), schools continue to operate in a challenging and uncertain financial climate and the additional investment still falls short of reversing the sustained pressures school budgets have faced in recent years. Many schools, locally and across the country, are facing budgetary pressures and are being forced to make difficult decisions. These include cutting back staffing, removing GCSE and A-Level subject options, reducing extra-curricular and enrichment activities, and scaling back trips and visits as highlighted by research conducted by the NFER which surveyed over 1000 schools in the state sector in England:



Year 11 Girls' Football Finals



Girls' football is booming in the local area and that is reflected in all our school teams. The current U16 football girls have been the pioneers for Ilkley Grammar School. They are the first full team of club players, demonstrating their excellent football ability in school competitions.

The team captain Annabelle Forster has been the driving force behind this team from the start. Annabelle is going to Sunderland Academy in September to pursue her football career, we wish her all the best. This team has won the U14 cup and league, U16 cup and league in Y10 and again in Y11. No IGS team has ever won the cup and the league, three years in a row. This is a unique performance and a phenomenal achievement!



The route to the Leeds Merit League and Leeds cup final 2025: This year has been challenging. When two key players sustained serious injuries earlier in the season, the rest of the squad successfully stepped up to keep the 'triple-double' dream alive. We finished first in the Merit League and to get to the final of the Leeds Cup, we beat Corpus Christi Catholic College, St Mary's Menston and Roundhay School.



The finals: With all players back to full fitness for the two finals, we were unbeatable. On Tuesday 6th May we won the Leeds Cup Final against Morley Academy 11-3. A week later we returned to Leeds Beckett University to play in the Leeds Merit League Final. The girls from Prince Henry's Grammar School had no answer for the great teamwork of our experienced squad and we beat them 11-3 as well!

Year 11 Boys' Football Final



The IGS year 11 boys beat Morley Academy 4-3 in the Leeds Champions of Champions Cup on Tuesday 13th May!

The goal scorers on the night were Noah Taylor-Smith (x2), Alex Pollard and Tom Goodall. It was an incredible battle and every player should be proud of their performance. IGS played some fantastic fluid



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football and were well organised across the whole pitch.

Noah opened the IGS scoring account inside the first 15 minutes, gaining possession after his tenacious press. Alex Pollard calmly slotted the ball in the bottom right corner to level it 2-2 before half time after IGS had sadly conceded two goals against the run of play, with Morley players managing to find themselves free from an otherwise impeccably organised and drilled defensive set up.

The second half saw Morley approach the game with a bit more bite, but the IGS players worked extremely hard for each other on and off the ball. IGS managed to make it 3-2 through another Noah Taylor-Smith goal, scoring after the ball fell to him after being spilled by the keeper, and later 4-2 from a fantastic solo run from Tom Goodall. Every single goal was celebrated as a full team! Morley kept digging deep and did claw back one goal to leave the game in the balance at 4-3, but the organisation and tenacity of the Ilkley side guided them through as 4-3 winners!

Pathway to the final:

Ilkley finished top of the NW Leeds league and their knockout pathway to the final involved facing Cardinal Heenan in the quarter final and Farnley Academy in the semi-final.

This final marked the 4th consecutive year the 'Green Ties' have reached the Champions Cup Final, winning 3 out of the 4 finals. They have been crowned Leeds Champions of Champions in year 8, 9 and 11. An incredible feat!



Year 7 Boys' Football Final



The IGS year 7 boys' football team beat Horsforth 3-2 in the Leeds League final on Wednesday 14th May!

IGS started strong and were attacking fiercely, however, it was Horsforth who scored first against the run of play. A superb response and continued



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attacking football allowed Ben Marsh to score next making it 1-1. This was followed by an exceptional run down the wing from Ted Airey who cut inside and scored in the bottom corner. A fantastic first half display was then topped off by an unbelievable half volley from outside the box which flew into the top corner from Ben Marsh for his second and Ilkley's third, making it 3-1 at half time.

During the second half it was Horsforth who started strong, securing their second goal. IGS once again showed resilience and determination as they continued to play outstanding football, managing to see the game out and were deserving 3-2 winners!

Route to the final:

Ilkley's season began back in October, winning their first two NW Leeds League games against Lawnswood and Menston. Seven months later they are champions and can now say they are the best team in Leeds! In the NW League Ilkley finished top however only on goal difference as Horsforth finished on the same points. We didn't know it at the time, but we would come to play Horsforth again in the final. The knockout pathway included wins against Allerton High School in the quarter final and Pudsey Grammar School in the semi-final.

Year 7 Girls' Football Finals

Leeds Cup Final: 2nd (4-1 to Cardinal Heenan)

A spirited performance from the IGS year 7 girls ultimately wasn't enough as they fell to a 4-1 defeat against Cardinal Heenan in a well-contested encounter on Wednesday 7th May at Leeds Beckett University. The scoreline did not reflect the intensity of the match, with Ilkley battling hard throughout. It was Cardinal Heenan who struck first, capitalising on a defensive lapse to open the scoring early through the first half. Despite pushing to find a way back into the game in the second half, Ilkley struggled to convert their chances, while Cardinal Heenan remained dangerous on the break. Despite the defeat, the effort and energy shown by Ilkley showed promise for their second finals a week later.

Leeds Merit League Final: 2nd (4-1 to Cardinal Heenan)

Ilkley return to Leeds Beckett University a week later facing Cardinal Heenan again, this time for the Merit League Finals. A change in formation was introduced to help breakdown Heenan's rapid attack. Ilkley showed greater strength and determination. The game was well contested with great attacking opportunities from both teams. Unfortunately for Ilkley, shots on target did not convert to goals, leading to a 4-1 defeat once again. A fantastic effort for the girls, showing lots of potential for the future.

Golf clubs wanted!



This June, IGS has been awarded a Social Value Certificate from the DofE celebrating our school's volunteering and impact for 2024/25! The Social Value Certificate recognises the fantastic work DofE participants do, both in and for their communities. It gives a monetary value to participants' efforts towards the Volunteering section of their DofE. We are so proud that our students have dedicated 1456 hours to voluntary work over the past 12 months, totalling a monetary value of £9318! We are extremely grateful to all of the staff at IGS who facilitate our incredibly successful DofE programme, including those who volunteer their evening and weekend time for the sometimes soggy, but always brilliant expeditions!

In May, the DofE announced that a record-breaking 342,000 young people had started a DofE programme in 2024-25 – the highest since the charity was founded almost 70 years ago. During the same period, participants have contributed an astonishing 5.2 million hours of volunteering in communities all over the UK – with an estimated total value of £33.4 million. Participation can begin in year 9 once your child turns 14. For year 8 students interested in taking part next year, look out for an assembly coming soon. Parents will also receive a notification in year 9 once we open applications to students.


