Dear Parents/Carers,

Please see attached the term dates for 2026/27 which have now been finalised. We have also attached the term dates for 2025/26, as these have been reissued with a slight update to the start of term dates for Post-16.

As we enter the final few weeks of the summer term, it's a perfect time to reflect on the achievements, opportunities and experiences that have already made this half-term so memorable.

Firstly, I want to offer my congratulations to all students who have taken part in this summer's examination series. Their conduct, resilience and determination have been exemplary throughout and are a testament to their character and hard work. Once again, they have been a credit to themselves, their families and to the school. I would also like to extend a sincere thank you to our examinations team and wider staff who have delivered this vast and complex operation with calm efficiency and professionalism. To give you a sense of the scale, over the past five weeks they have supervised 830 candidates, sitting I I 9 different exams and have overseen the organisation and completion of 8552 exam papers – each one representing years of learning, hours of preparation and revision and countless moments of perseverance. These figures give just a snapshot of the immense logistical effort behind the scenes – all delivered with a shared sense of purpose and met with focus and commitment from our students.

At the same time, students have also continued to engage in wider enrichment activities that allow them to grow in confidence, understanding and ambition – fulfilling our school motto: **Sapientia et statura proficiamus.**

One standout example is our continued involvement in the Lexus Ilkley Open, held at the Ilkley Lawn Tennis and Squash Club. This year marked a historic milestone, as the women's competition joined the WTA Tour for the first time, sitting alongside the men's ATP 125 Challenger tournament and making the event an even more prestigious fixture in the British grass court season. Almost 90 of our students received specialist training and served as members of the ball crew, showing exceptional professionalism, energy and teamwork. While I had the pleasure and privilege of watching those selected for finals day, my congratulations go to every student who contributed to making the event such a success. Unfazed by the record crowds, they were all such positive ambassadors for IGS and for tennis throughout the week!

Equally impressive, has been our biggest and most ambitious Year 12 Next Steps Week to date: a week packed with inspiration, insight and practical preparation for life beyond school. In total, students engaged in over 100 sessions, including presentations from 14 employers, 8 apprenticeship providers, 11 IGS alumni and 15 universities, alongside opportunities to visit Leeds Art University and Leeds Beckett University. This was an outstanding week of learning beyond the classroom, equipping students with the confidence and knowledge to make informed decisions about their future.

This week, we've also had the joy of celebrating the Year II Prom, a special and emotional moment for many. Held at the Craiglands Hotel, the evening was a wonderful celebration of all that this year group has accomplished. For some, it marked the end of the exam season; for others, the end of their 5-year journey with us at IGS. We look forward to sharing a full feature in the next bulletin, but for now I want to thank staff and students for making the event such a warm, inclusive and memorable occasion.

Just as powerful, though in a different way, was our 5th annual Diversity Day, which saw year 9 students step away from their normal timetable to engage in a rich programme of workshops, exploring different aspects of identity, inclusion and equality. With sessions led by guest speakers, staff and our exceptional year 12 iLeaders, students enjoyed a range of specialist workshops including anti-racism, British Sign Language, African drumming, neurodiversity, gender equality and LGBTQ+ inclusion. It is a day that embodies our values, celebrating difference, developing understanding and broadening perspectives. Again, there will be a full feature in the next parent/carer bulletin.

There is still much to come before the end of term, including our 3-day Creative Arts Festival and inaugural art auction, year 6 Transition Day for our new "Green Ties" and, of course, Challenge and Celebration week. I hope this bulletin gives a sense of the richness of school life here at IGS and our continued commitment to students "growing in wisdom and stature".



Attendance Update

We have long understood the importance of good attendance at school: every moment matters. Over the past few months, new research has been published by the DfE which shows just how much every day at school counts.

At IGS we want every student to attend school regularly, and this year we have seen significant improvement in all our headline attendance figures. We want to continue to improve every individual's attendance through our sensitive and supportive approach, that recognises the difficulty some students have attending school regularly.



At IGS, alongside the usual support from year teams, we have a Families and Outreach Specialist, Miss Ruth Sturgess (pictured left) who in partnership with the attendance team is willing and able to support families and students to improve their attendance. There are a substantial number of additional interventions and adjustments we can make in school to Attendance Matters!

Summary of DfE's research:

The link between attendance and attainment is at its strongest in secondary school. Year 11 students with nearperfect attendance are almost twice as likely to achieve grade 5 in English and Maths GCSE, compared to similar students attending 90-95% of the time. In other words, missing just 10 extra days a year reduces the likelihood of achieving these grades by around half.














At lower attendance levels, students who only attend between 50 and 55% of the time are 1.6 times more likely to achieve 9-5 in Maths and English GCSE than students who are severely absent and attend less than 50% of sessions. Increased attendance from severely absent to 60-65% (equating to approximately an extra 4-6 weeks in school) is associated with double the likelihood of the expected outcome compared with students who attend less than 50% of the time.

Improving attendance by just 5% makes a significant difference to academic attainment, as you can see in the chart below:

The link between school attendance and lifetime earnings

Missing school doesn't just affect exam results and a child's time in education. The impact of poor attendance has an impact on future earnings too. Related research has found that, for every day of absence between Years 7 to 11, the typical pupil could miss out on an average of £750 in future lifetime earnings. That's £750 less for every single day missed.

The research also found that a one day increase in absence in Years 10 and 11 alone is associated with a 0.8% decrease in total yearly pay-as-you-earn earnings and declared self-employed earnings at age 28.

Persistently absent students in secondary school could earn £10,000 less at age 28 compared to students with near-perfect attendance.

As with attainment, it is clear to see the direct relationship between good attendance at school and higher earnings at the age of 28. You can see the DfE's full research report here.

Everyday matters

We need to make sure that good attendance at school remains a high priority. We already ask that families only keep children off school when they are too ill to attend. We have produced a document using NHS guidance that will help with this decision making here.

Every day at school gives you a better chance of good attainment, and greater earning power in adulthood therefore good attendance is an investment in the future.



Animal rescue!

Whilst everyday at IGS brings its own surprises, two of our year 11 students had no idea that on 11th June they would become heroes! Francis McCann and Douglas Cook were walking into Ilkley whilst on study leave, and came across a policeman trying to reunite a lost lamb with its mother. Our students' behaviour was so exemplary that the police officer involved sent us this message following the incident:



This afternoon an ewe and its lamb have somehow ended up at the bottom of Cowpasture Road. As I arrived the lamb made a break for it and ran into town in a distressed state.

Two of your pupils were passing and assisted with trying to safely locate the lamb which was captured

up on Wells Rd. The animals were reunited and your pupils went to acquire some water for the animals which improved the health of the ewe.













The pupils then assisted with moving the animals to a better location away from dogs. The students are both on study leave for their GCSE's and stayed with me for 2 hours to ensure we kept the animals in a safe place. Without the assistance of your pupils it is unlikely that we would have located the lamb again. This was a top effort by the students and with their efforts ensured the best outcome for the animals.


