Dear Parents/Carers,

The positive start to the year has continued, with excellent attendance, enthusiastic participation in extra-curricular clubs, and an impressive number of achievement points awarded for living our school values. Since the beginning of term, students have now earned over 65,000 achievement points, with an outstanding achievement-to-behaviour point ratio of 22:1. Of these, more than 15,000 points have been awarded for Courage, nearly 14,000 for Resilience, and almost 13,000 for Pride.

Following our Leadership and Enrichment Fayre, it has been wonderful to see so many students engaging in the wide range of opportunities available. This term there are over 80 clubs on offer, covering 50 different activities so there really is something for everyone. With applications for iLeader roles closing earlier this week, it has also been inspiring to see such enthusiasm from students across the school, with 646 new applications, including 155 year 7 and 228 year 12 students who have applied for positions of responsibility.

We are also pleased that 42 year 7 students successfully auditioned for the chorus for *Billy Elliot*. The full cast list is published in today's bulletin, and it will be fantastic to see our youngest students working alongside older year groups to create what promises to be another memorable production.

Next week, we look forward to welcoming families of children in year 6 to our Open Day and Open Evening as we showcase all that IGS has to offer. Our students remain our greatest ambassadors, and it is a privilege to watch them volunteer as tour guides and subject helpers with such pride. Last year, over 900 families preferenced IGS, and demand for places continues to exceed availability. We will share photos of this year's event in the next edition of the bulletin.



Sustainable Uniform Sale July 2025

Last July the Eco i-Leaders held their fourth annual sustainable uniform sale. The event is becoming increasingly popular year-on-year as word of the sale spreads. Whilst the main purpose of the event is to get as much pre-loved uniform and school items



back into circulation as possible, it also has the added benefit of allowing families to buy essentials, and spares, at a much-reduced cost compared to that of buying new.

As usual the school blazers, were our best sellers at only £5.00 each. Closely followed by the sports hoodies which, with names





removed by one of our lovely science technicians, are even more of a bargain at also £5.00 each.













This year the Eco i-Leaders introduced a better labelling system, with the addition of colour coded hanger-markers so that shoppers could find sizes more easily and, with extra clothes hangers, more items were sorted onto rails and available within easy reach. All items were priced at no more than £5 each and we had so many white shirts donated that we were able to give away the first 5 to every student for free!

Altogether the sale raised an impressive total of £2,508!

That's placing well over 500 individual items back into use and creating a sustainable circular economy.

Mathematics Success at IGS!

The 2024-25 academic year was another one to celebrate for mathematics students at Ilkley Grammar School, with our year 11 and year 13 students achieving a fantastic set of results in their GCSEs and A Levels respectively. Outside of the main exam year groups, we have also been very impressed with the hard work and the dedication to both improving and succeeding that has been showcased by every single year group.

A big factor in our mathematics success has been Sparx Maths. We have been very proud of how well the vast majority of students have embraced this platform, not only as a homework system but as a key resource in independent learning and revision. At the end of last year, students at IGS had answered 1,294,930 questions correctly. This equates to 24,260 hours of personalised maths practice completed by IGS students, with 211,798 occasions where Sparx videos have been used to support improvement!

Why did we help the food bank?

We helped the food bank because we wanted to give the families of Ilkley a fair share of all food and help them through tough times. We were delighted to have been asked to help with the food collecting and organising. It also links with our school values of kindness and responsibility.

Some of the items that were collected:

Some of the items we collected were chocolate, sweets, tinned tomatoes and sweetcorn, microwave rice, flour, sugar, UHT milk, laundry detergent, shampoo and conditioner. The foodbank were running low on these items.

How much was donated?

We filled TWO cars! They were practically bursting with donations! They got delivered to the Armitage Café. We got a lot of donations and we are incredibly proud and grateful that we had the chance help.

How we helped to organise donations:

Donations were brought into school after Mr Revell sent an email with a list of suggestions. He helped us to organise it by putting boxes around the room and labelled each one with a type of food. This helps the foodbank stock shelves quicker. 7LIR helped by thanking donors then putting all the food into the labelled boxes and then carefully carrying all of them to the cars. Teamwork made it a speedy process!

Thank you to everyone that donated!

The foodbank were so overwhelmed by IGS' support that we received a letter of thanks from Alex Gibson on behalf of the Trustees of Ilkley Foodbank:

May I thank you, your staff and your pupils (and their parents of course!) for your School's generous donation to Ilkley Foodbank which we received yesterday. We are most grateful and it will help us reach out to individuals and families in Ilkley, Addingham, Burley in Wharfedale and Menston who are struggling to make ends meet at this time. We are also grateful that your staff took the time to sort the donations into categories making it so much easier to stack the donations in our store!



Whilst Ilkley is seen as being an affluent area, we currently have over 60 clients on our books of which 27 are families and include 40 children. Many of the parents are in employment but with rising rents, low-paid zero hours contracts, and with food prices and energy costs having risen by over 30% in the last three years, they are still struggling to put food on the table.



Ilkley Foodbank is staffed solely by unpaid volunteers. We do not receive either Council or Government support but instead we rely on the generosity of our supporters who contribute either financially, by standing order, or in kind by leaving donations in our baskets at Booths, Tesco and Ilkley Co-op. For this generous support we are very grateful.

Once again thank you all for choosing llkley Foodbank as the beneficiary of your harvest festival. I can assure you that everything that you donated will be put to good use amongst the most vulnerable in our community.













Flu vaccine consent

We have received the following information from NHS Bradford District Care:

The School Immunisation team will be in school soon to vaccinate children from Reception to Year 11 against flu. Your child will not receive the vaccine if you have not given your consent so, "Yes" or "No", the School Immunisation team needs you to please fill in the consent form which will be sent to you from school.



The flu vaccine is slightly different each year due to different strains of flu, so even if your child was vaccinated last year, they need the vaccine again this year and your consent is required.

Flu is not "just a bad cold", it is a nasty illness that can be very unpleasant for children and can also cause serious problems, such as pneumonia. Symptoms can come on quickly. They can include a sudden high temperature, an aching body, cough, sore throat, loss of appetite, pain in the ear, diarrhoea or tummy pain, feeling and being sick and difficulty sleeping. Children will also appear less active.

Each winter thousands of children who do not have a health condition need hospital care because of flu. Because children catch and spread flu easily, they can also pass it to people in your family or community who are at higher risk of getting seriously ill from flu, such as babies, anyone who's pregnant and older people.

Most children are offered the nasal spray flu vaccine. It contains a small amount of gelatine from pigs (porcine gelatine). A flu vaccine injection is available that does not contain gelatine. If you do not want your child to have the nasal spray vaccine, please ask for the flu vaccine injection on the school consent form.


IGS PE Team awarded for QA Best Practice!
